Ternan Elected New Bay View President

Merrell, Mitchell, Crandell, Zetterberg Win Trustee Vote

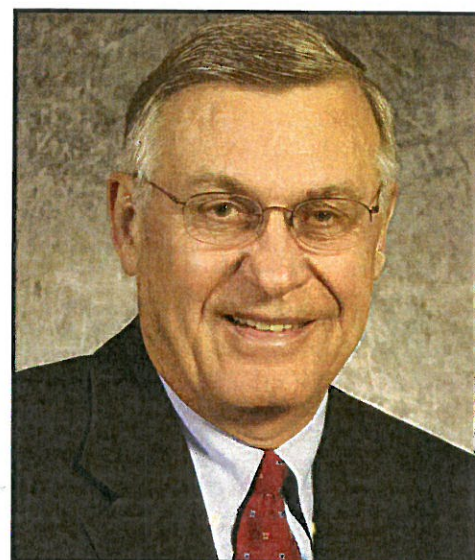
The Bay View Board of Trustees elected Lawrence R. Ternan the 22nd president of the Association at its organizational meeting Saturday, Aug. 2.

Ternan, an Auburn Hills attorney, succeeds Thomas C. Shearer, who decided not to seek re-election. Shearer had been president since 2002, and remains on the board as a trustee for one more year.

Ternan and his wife, Suzanne, have been Bay View cottage-owners since 1975. He was appointed trustee in 2006 and re-elected a year later. He expressed thanks to the trustees for their vote of confidence.

"I look forward to the upcoming year of challenges and opportunities as we move into the 'Heart of Bay View' campaign," Ternan said. "Our programs were well received this summer by our audiences. We must now address the building's ... deficiencies to provide a quality experience for our members, guests and patrons."

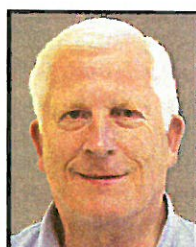
Members Saturday also elected four trustees at the Annual Meeting.

Winning three-year terms were Barbara Merrell (345 votes), Katherine Mitchell (344) and Rose Crandell (286). Robert Zetterberg (272) won a two-year term. Unsuccessful candidates were Richard Crossland (235), Arthur Anderson (184) and Richard Kelbaugh (141).

The board elected Glenn Stevens vice-president; re-elected Crandell secretary; and elected Merrell treasurer.

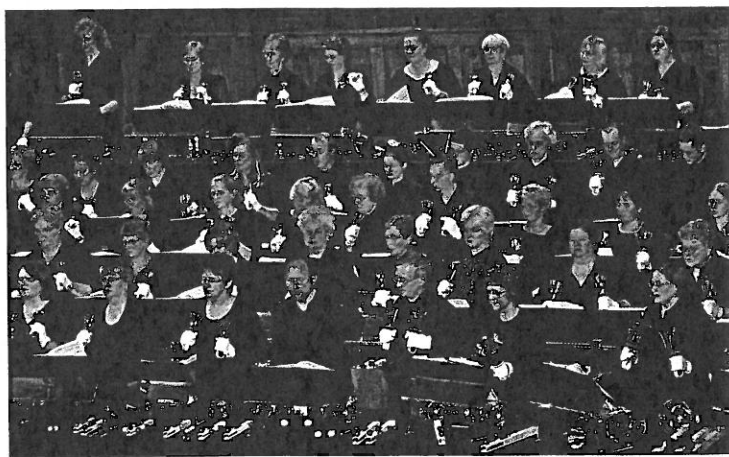
"Week of Handbells" Concert Thursday

The 2008 Bay View "Week of Handbells" concert is scheduled for 8 p.m. Thursday, Aug. 14, in John M. Hall Auditorium.

This year's concert will have somewhat of a jazzy feel to it. The 100 or so handbell ringers, under the direction of Carl Wiltse, will be joined by the Larry Washburn Jazz Trio in an arrangement of Erroll Garner's "Misty."

The Trio will also be playing for the audience and ringers at the intermission. Besides Washburn, the Trio members are Larry Wojcik on drums and Gig Stewart on bass.

The concert will open with "Jazz Fanfare and Alleluia" scored for organ and bells. David Eicher will again be at the organ. Also on the concert is "Gospel Praise God," a swinging gospel arrangement of the familiar hymn tune "Duke Street." Another selection that might fit into the jazz category is "La Paix," as it has some decidedly jazzy chord progressions.

I count it as one of God's great gifts that this very special man reached out across a huge divide of age and achievement to take a lasting interest in my life.

My story is repeated in the lives of countless others who found life-changing mentors among the gifted adults that abounded in this grace filled place.

Voorhies Hall has occupied an important place in Bay View's life since the moment of its dedication. Voorhies enabled the Religion and Life Hour to escape the hugeness of Hall Auditorium to more intimate and suitable space.

It rescued the Sunday School from the inconveniences imposed by Hall, from where, after opening ceremonies, we were scattered to cottages all over Bay View for our classes. Lucie and I now live in the cottage where I went to

Sunday school classes for several years.

Voorhies has proved a suitable venue for the production of plays and other smaller musical events, and the opera program found its home here in its growing years.

I am honored and pleased to be part of the rededication and rejuvenation of this invaluable part of the ongoing life of Bay View.

May it go on for another half century and more!

arrangements of familiar music taken from the classical and liturgical repertoire. Original compositions include "Psalm 42, Allegro Glorioso" by Saginaw composer Catherine McMichael, and "Incalzando" written by the founder of the "Week of Handbells" and former Bay View member Dr. Donald E. Allured.

Transcriptions include Bach's "Little

Fugue in G Minor," Fauré's "Cantique de Jean Racine," and Moussorgsky's "The Great Gate of Kiev." Arrangements include "Shall We Gather at the River," and Wiltse's arrangement of "Annie Laurie." Featured on the concert will be "Alleluia! The Scribe is O'er" arranged for bells and organ by Fred Gramann, who is Music Director at the American Church in Paris, and is attending this year's Week of Handbells.

Video and audio recordings of the concert will be available from Pierpont Productions of Harbor Springs, and can be ordered at the concert. There will also be a large display of handbell music and supplies for sale, including those selections on the concert.

There is no admission charge for the concert. A free will offering will be received at intermission to benefit the Bay View Summer Music Festival student scholarship fund.
