# Handbells Charm Bay View

For 37 years the sound of handbells have been ringing in Bay View. Each year Carl Wiltse, Director, comes from Scotland to conduct Bay View's annual handbell concert. This vear 104 handbell ringers arrived in

rthern Michigan from the United States, Canada and France. Many ringers consider Bay View their favorite ringing experience and return year after year.

In order to participate a ringer registers on line and the window for registration closes when the maximum of 104 registrants isreached. It can be as short as 48 hours, but sometimes longer. Once registered, plans to travel to Bay View begin. Each ringer pays tuition, travel expenses and other personal costs in order to participate. One of the

handbell ringers, Sheena Hunter, travels from her home in Maryland to Pennsylvania and transports the bass bells and chimes directly from the factory, Malmark Handbells, Inc.,
