marked at this year's Bay View Week of Handbells concert on Thursday, August 17, at 8:00 p.m. in John M. Hall Auditorium. The concert is the 40th performance of this annual event. T' octor Carl Wiltse will be marking his year as director, following founder Dr. Donald E. Allured. This will also be Wiltse's last performance as Director. Next year he will hand over the baton to Fred Gramann, who hails from Paris, France. Gramann has attended numerous Week of Handbells concerts, first as a ringer, and in more recent years as co-Director with Wiltse. They will share the directing duties at this year's concert.

Gramann is a native of Washington State where he began organ studies with Dr. Edward Hansen of Seattle. He earned organ performance degrees from Syracuse University and the University of Michigan. With his wife Nancy, he moved to Paris in 1972 for organ study with Marie-Claire Alain and Maurice

Durussé. Since 1976, he has been Director of Music at the American Church in Paris where he is organist and conducts the

Adult Choir, the ACP Bronze Ringers, and the Celebration Ringers. Fred also organizes the weekly Sunday evening classical concert series. He has numerous choral and handbell works published in

the United States and is the Honorary Associate Director of the Raleigh Ringers of North Carolina as well as co-conductor for the yearly European Handbell Festival.

Wiltse, who has been a part of the Week of Handbells for all of its 40 years, said of Gramann, "We could not have chosen a better leader for the future. Fred is known world-wide as a master

Rev. Richard F. Ward to Speak in Bay View, August 13-17

The Rev. Richard F. Ward is Professor of Homiletics and Worship at Phillips Theological Seminary, where he holds the Fred B. Craddock Chair. He earned his B.A. from Oklahoma Baptist University, his M.F.A. from Trinity University (in conjunction with the Dallas Theater Center), his M.A.R. from the Christian Theological Seminary, and his Ph.D. from Northwestern University.

Richard brings to the study of preaching a rich background in performance studies and practices. He is particularly interested in the art of storytelling and oral interpretation of scripture as they inform

This year's concert is entitled A Box of Suites and Other Treats. Many of the

selections are transcriptions from such

works as Grieg's Peer Gynt Suite and Holberg Suite, Stravinsky's The Firebird Suite, Tchaikovsky's Nutcracker Suite, Saint-Saëns's Carnival of the Animals, Rachmaninoff's Fantasy Suite 1, Handel's Suite No. 7, McChesney's Colorado Suite, and Moussorgsky's Pictures at an Exhibition.

Specially featured on the concert is Coronation and Triumphant Exultation, by Larry Sue. The piece was commissioned for this year's concert from a fund

established to honor the event's founder, Dr. Donald E. Allured. Every two years a different composer is selected to write an original piece for handbells. This year's piece is dedicated to retiring Director Wiltse.

There is no admission charge for the concert, but a free-will offering will be received to benefit the student scholarship fund of the Bay View Music Festival. The concert is not appropriate for young children.
